10. Reports:

Hacheston Parish Council have discussed the issue of traffic on the B1078.

Councillors are sympathetic with the initiative but have some reservations. We have no data from our Speed Indicating Device ID to evidence a significant increase in the speed and volume of traffic and we believe that some of it is agricultural transport which is unavoidable. This could include vehicles serving the biomass plant at Bentwaters.

We agree that the section of road between the Five Ways roundabout and Campsea Ashe is potentially dangerous. It is a narrow road with blind corners and no footways, we have received numerous complaints about the speed and volume of traffic and we are working with SCC Highways to deal with the problem. For example we have a Speed Indicating Device warning Eastbound traffic to slow down and we have requested that SCC deploy a VAS.

Hacheston councillors are happy to join any further discussions about the traffic issues but prefer not to sign your letter with the current wording.

A further request was made but this matter cannot be revisited for another six months

Complaint was received about a bonfire which was passed to Environmental Services ES

Mud on road from sugar beet harvesting was reported

Blocked drains from mud reported
